#### 101st Legislature Recap

#### • Enacted/Adopted:

- o Four-year terms
- o \$25M boost in liquor tax revenue
- Court funding sunset extension May 2024
- Secondary Road Patrol funding stream
- Materials Management Plans

#### • Defeated/Deferred:

- Mental health privatization
- FOIA changes
- Binding arbitration expansion







### 102<sup>nd</sup> Legislature

- Democratic majority
- New leadership
- Slim margins
- Hot topic issues
- Former county commissioners







#### **2023 Priorities**

- Revising Open Meetings Act to Meet Demands of 21st Century
- Creating Fair Revenue Sharing System for Counties
- Enacting Reforms to Ensure Proper Funding of Local Courts
- Increasing Resources for Juvenile Justice Services
- Compensating Local Governments for Funds Diverted by Veterans Property Tax Exemption
- Revamping PPT Exemption to Provide Annual Reimbursement to Locals







### 2023 Priority: Open Meetings Act

#### Pre-pandemic remote participation rules:

- o Bill sponsor: Sen. Klinefelt, D-Macomb
- Remote participation and voting
- Quorum must be present
- Likely to have guardrails
- Not a partisan issue

#### Linguistic rewrite:

- o Bill sponsor: Rep. Bierlein, R-Tuscola
- Re-introduction from last session







### 2023 Priority: Revenue Sharing Trust Fund

#### Creation of dedicated fund:

- Automatic deposit of revenue into fund
- Still subject to appropriation

#### MAC's preferred version:

- SBs 229-230 (Sen. Klinefelt, D-Macomb)
- Percentage of sales tax
- o 50/50 distribution

#### MML version:

- SBs 182-183 (Sens. Webber, R-Oakland, & Moss, D-Oakland) & HBs 4274-75 (Reps. O'Neal, D-Saginaw, & Tisdel, R-Oakland)
- Floor funding no built-in growth
- o 47/53 split with CVTs








### 2023 Priority: Trial Court Funding

- Fee extension sunset May 2024
- Trial Court Funding Commission recommendations:
  - Uniform assessments
  - Centralized collections
- People v. Johnson (MSC case)
- FY24 budget request: \$46M

### 2023 Priority: Juvenile Justice Resources

- Increase in beds and facilities
- Funding for staff:
  - o Recruiting
  - Retention
  - Training
- Support governor's call for 8% increase in foster care per diems
- Statewide ask: \$150M







# 2023 Priority: Veterans Property Tax Exemption Reimbursement

- 2013 statewide mandate:
  - Close to \$100M lost to local governments
  - o 14% increase in exemptions each year

#### Reimbursement method:

- SBs 95-96 Sen. Bumstead (R-Muskegon)
- Refundable income tax credit payable to locals
- Supported by veterans organizations







# 2023 Priority: PPT Exemption Reimbursements

- Effective this year:
  - o \$180,000 in true cash value
  - Estimated \$75M in local revenue lost
  - Money set aside
- Reimbursement methodology:
  - Failed to pass House (December 2022)
  - o Reintroduction expected this week








### FY 24 Budget

- Dwindling surplus
- Income tax rollback
- EITC increase
- SOAR funding/economic development
- Cuts to Exec Budget in subcommittee budgets
- May Consensus Revenue Estimating Conference







### Legislation of Interest

#### Solar PILT:

- Reintroduction: HBs 4317-18 (Reps. VanderWall, R-Mason, & Neeley, D-Genesee)
- \$7,000 per MW
- Distribution based on % of millage
- Local option

#### Rail grade separation:

- o SBs 124-125 (Sen. Camilleri, D-Wayne)
- MDOT grant program
- o 20% local match









### **Legislation of Interest**

#### • Criminal Justice Reform Policy Commission:

- HB 4173 (Rep. Aiyash, D-Wayne)
- MAC appointee
- Analyze corrections data
- Modify sentencing guidelines

#### • Juvenile justice reform:

- o 18-bill package
- Increase CCF reimbursement to 75% community based services only
- o Enhanced screening risk and mental health
- Expands MIDC to juveniles







### **Legislation of Interest**

- Aggregate mining:
  - Local pre-emption for permitting
  - o Anticipated introduction and fast movement
- Watershed management:
  - HBs 4382-83 (Reps. Morse, D-Kalamazoo,
     & VanderWall, R-Mason)
  - Stormwater management on watershed basis
  - o Paid through special assessments
  - Varied eligible activities








### **Legislation of Interest**

#### • Renewable energy:

- o SB 271 (Sen. Geiss, D-Wayne)
- o 100% renewable by 2035
- o Eliminate coal and non-renewable generation

#### • Public notice reform:

- HB 4428 (Rep. Coleman, D-Wayne)
- Online publication
- Archive and posting retention requirements
- Distribution to newspapers
- o Annual first-class mailing option
- Hundreds of trailer bills required







#### Issues to Watch

- Statewide Septic Code:
  - Anticipated introduction this spring
  - Period inspection requirements
- Binding arbitration expansion:
  - o HB 4438 (Rep. Breen, D-Oakland)
  - Expansion to county corrections officers
- Stormwater utility:
  - Reintroduction expected
  - Stormwater management within municipal boundaries








#### **Issues to Watch**

#### Road funding:

- Declining gas tax revenue
- EV market share
- Urban vs. rural

#### • Early warning:

- Supplement/supplant EM law
- Stages of involvement by Treasury
- Local appointees to assist local boards
