MICHIGAN SOCIAL STUDIES CONTENT EXAMPLES

YMCA MYIG students debate, deliberate, research, write and about issues that are important to them. By voting, signing petitions and completing jury selection, they take what they learn in the classroom and put it into action. Below are a few competencies

addressed at MYIG. The whole list can be found under the "Roadmap to Citizenship" on myig.org/toolkit

- **P3.1** Identifying and Analyzing Public Issues Selecting, researching, and writing a bill, on an issue important to their community.
- **C1.1** Purpose of Government Deliberate the purposes and roles of government with peers from all across Michigan.
- **C3.3** Describe and analyze how groups and individuals influence public policy Deliberate across a diverse range of ideas, people and stakeholders including media, lobbyist and cabinet officials.
- **C6.3.2** Rights and Responsibilities of Civic Society Vote in an election, analyze candidates through various media and forms including Town Halls, speeches, ads and interaction.

Senators & Representatives

Research, present and debate bills in the House and Senate Chambers.

Contemporary Issues Forum

Research an assigned question and compete as a team in a standard debate format.

Political Compromise

Research a policy question, debate with other stake-holders and develop a recommendation.



High School Program

Senators & Representatives

Research, present and debate bills in the House and Senate

Governor's Cabinet

Advocate for the Youth Governor's agenda and defend against veto overrides.

Press Corps

Develop and produce daily print and video coverage of the hot topics across the conference.

National Issues Forum

Research and debate issues of national and/or international importance.

Lobbyists

Influence passage of legislation through lobbying of peers, initiate citizen petitions.

Model Judiciary Program

Prepare as a witness and an attorney to compete in a round robin Mock Trial tournament.
