## Understanding Community Needs: ALICE

Who is ALICE?

<u>A</u>sset <u>L</u>imited, <u>I</u>ncome <u>C</u>onstrained, <u>E</u>mployed – households that earn above the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) but cannot afford the basic cost of living in their county. Despite struggling to make ends meet, ALICE households often do not qualify for public assistance.

Household Survival Budget: The cost of essentials including housing, child care, food, transportation, and a smartphone plan, plus taxes.

ALICE Threshold: The minimum average income that a household needs to afford the essentials in the Household Survival Budget.

Poverty: Households earning below the Federal Poverty Level


