


Assessing Impact

Opioid Settlement Principles Resource and Indicators (OSPRI)

Interactive Online Tool

- Tool to monitor strategies funded with opioid settlement funds to address the drug overdose crisis and improve public health outcomes in the community
- Assists in determining indicators related to the priorities and needs determined by local governments
- Allow for understanding of the effectiveness of, and improved ability to report on, outcomes associated with investments
- OSPRI was developed by a working group from Vital Strategies and Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health with additional contributions from Pew Charitable Trusts, Shatterproof, the CDC Foundation, and the National Association of Counties.

Opioid Settlement Principles Resource and Indicators

STEP 1

Where to start:

Upon entering the tool, the user is prompted to select either a Core Abatement Strategy that the jurisdiction plans to pursue in order to address one of its priorities or a Key Performance Question, a question that the user or community may be asking about the particular priority such as, "Are we improving access to medications for opioid use disorder?"

STEP 2

Narrow your parameters:

The user may also choose to filter the indicators by setting (where the user intends for an activity or intervention to be implemented) or by area of the opioid response continuum (prevention, harm reduction, treatment, or recovery).

STEP 3

Tailor your results:

Next, the user can further refine the list of indicators based on how specific their planned response is. The user can continue to explore the range of possible activities or interventions, and the corresponding indicators by selecting a different Core Abatement Strategy, Key Performance Question, Setting or Continuum, all of which remain as filters the user can select in order to tailor the resulting table to the needs of the local community.

STEP 4

Align with your priorities:

OSPRI will display a range of possible activities or interventions that are known to be effective in reducing overdose risks along with a list of corresponding indicators in a table below the selection. These indicators serve as suggestions to the user about what to 'track' or monitor when a specific activity or intervention is implemented.

OSPRI also offers suggested data tips including where to find the data and a tooltip of how to calculate the indicator.


STEP 5

Use your results:


Once the user has created a custom table based on your responses, OSPRI offers a curated list of indicators that can be used to monitor opioid settlement investments. These indicators can be used to communicate reporting expectations to grantees that receive settlement funding. Jurisdictions can include these indicators in Requests For Proposals (RFPs) and listed in grant awards/contracts as what grantees must report to account for their activities.

OSPRI offers a print function so that the user can share the output with other stakeholders who are working to reduce overdose risks in their community. Opioid Settlement Principles Resource and Indicators

Open through May 10

- The purpose of the survey is to gauge:
- Annual reporting information on county planning for, and utilization of, opioid settlement funds
- Technical assistance needs of each county
- Participation is voluntary Survey is expected to take 15-20 minutes to complete
- Goal is it receive 1 response per county, completed by whoever is leading settlement planning efforts
- County governments may be eligible for a financial incentive up to \$1,000 for participating in the survey and completing all indicated questions

Responses from this survey will allow for:

- Annual reporting of planning processes and spending trends by counties
- Guiding MAC's technical assistance services
- Ease of access to see other county governments public-facing materials, including meeting minutes, websites, planning process documents, workplans, etc.
- 2024 report from MAC directed to county leadership on themes and lessons learned

Survey contents:

- Funding information and fund sharing
- Stakeholder engagement & planning processes
- Strategies/activities funded aligned with Exhibit E
- Optional ability to provide additional detail
- Public-facing websites or documents
- Resources utilized
- Additional support needs

- Data will be used to update MAC opioid settlement dashboard (Engagement, Planning, Management and Strategies pages) and create a report for county leadership

The First Church of God's proposal presents a promising initiative with the introduction of male transitional housing in Berrien County, addressing a critical need in the community. The substantial in-kind contribution and holistic approach to addressing the various needs of individuals struggling with substance use disorders, including transportation, financial planning, and personal development, are commendable. The proposal demonstrates a thorough understanding of the community's needs and offers measurable and sustainable solution, allowing graduates to become self-sustaining upon successful completion of the program. Furthermore, the attention given to the jail population and transportation access is noteworthy. Comments from the committee laud the proposal's comprehensive nature, detailed project description, data-driven approach, and demonstrated partnerships. Although there were not many weakness in the proposal the committee would like to emphasize that there is a heavy reliance on the onboarding of a competent case manager and the absence of an identified provider for Medication Assisted Treatment. Also, there were discrepancies in cohort numbers and a relatively low projected impact on the number of individuals over a three-year period. Additionally, capital expenditures in the manner detailed in the budget have proven to be integral to service provision. The committee is happy to recommend the First Church of Gods proposal for full funding as detailed in their application.

The Sacred Heart Rehabilitation Center's proposal impressively outlines the creation of a therapist position that promises self-sustainability within nine months, alongside the deployment of two peer recovery coaches to a partner organization, and addressing a crucial need for transportation in accessing treatment services. The proposal's thoroughness, cross-referencing, and collaboration efforts are commendable, as evidenced by letters of support and its capacity to serve over 700 new individuals. Moreover, the proposal's focus on social health and its utilization of capital expenditures to enhance services are seen as integral by the committee. However, areas for improvement include the need for greater detail in tracking service expansion and prioritizing the needs of Berrien County residents, as well as clarity on government funding sources for sustainability, particularly concerning the ongoing support for peer recovery coaches. While the Committee is happy to recommend Sacred Heart Rehabilitation center for full funding as detailed in their application, the committee advises Sacred Heart Rehabilitation Center to address these concerns to ensure the continued success and impact of their proposed initiatives during this and possible future funding cycles.
