Trial Court System Overview

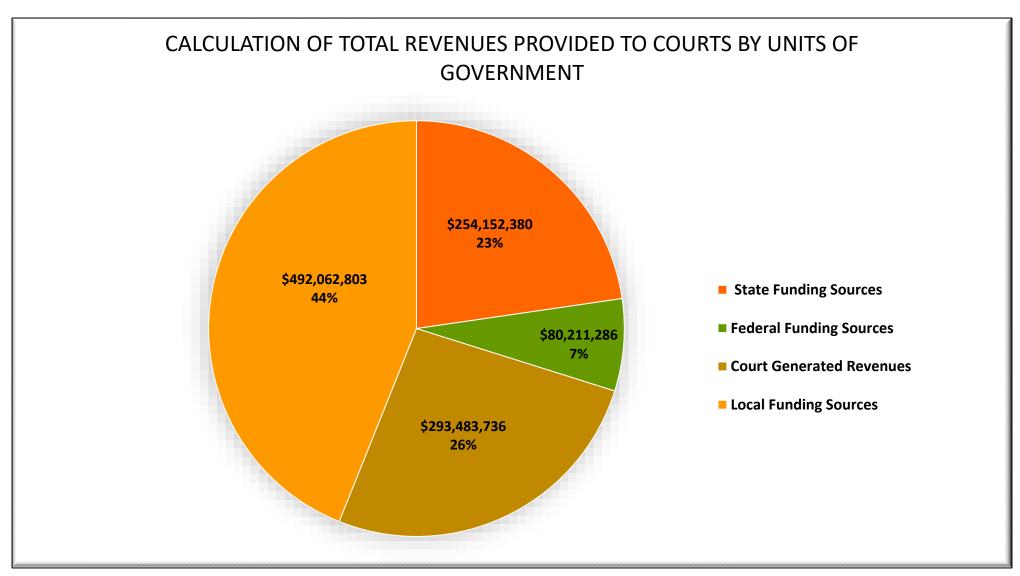

 - □ 103 District Courts
 - □ 4 Municipal Courts
 - > 559 total circuit, district, probate and municipal Judges
 - > 9,000 employees
 - ☐ <u>Legislative response:</u> Authorized trial courts to levy costs. Statute included sunset provision extending this authority to October 17, 2020 (Act 64 of 2017). Act 151 of 2020 extended again to <u>October 2022.</u>

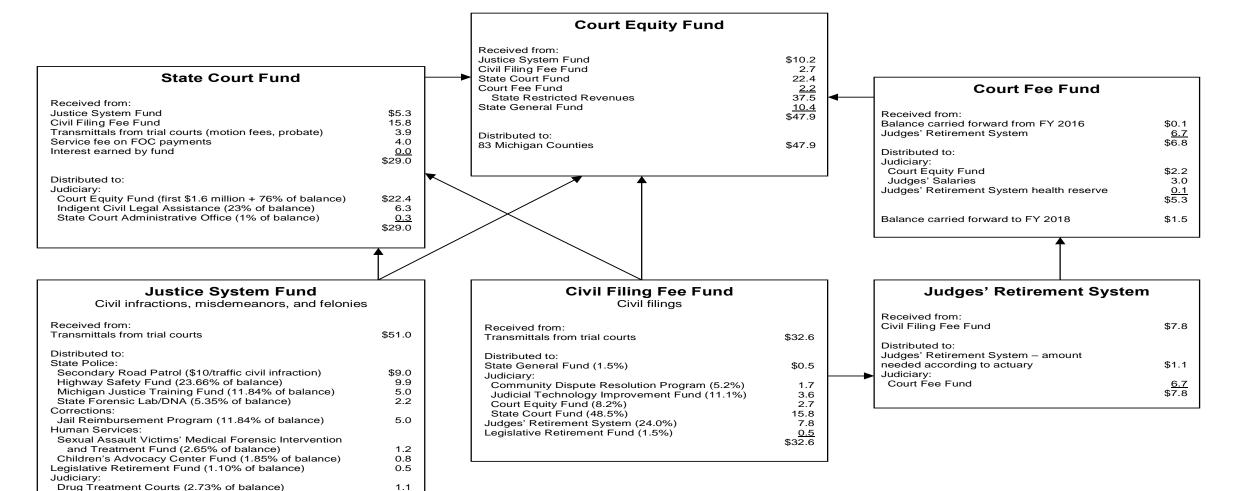

Court Equity Fund (24.33% of balance)

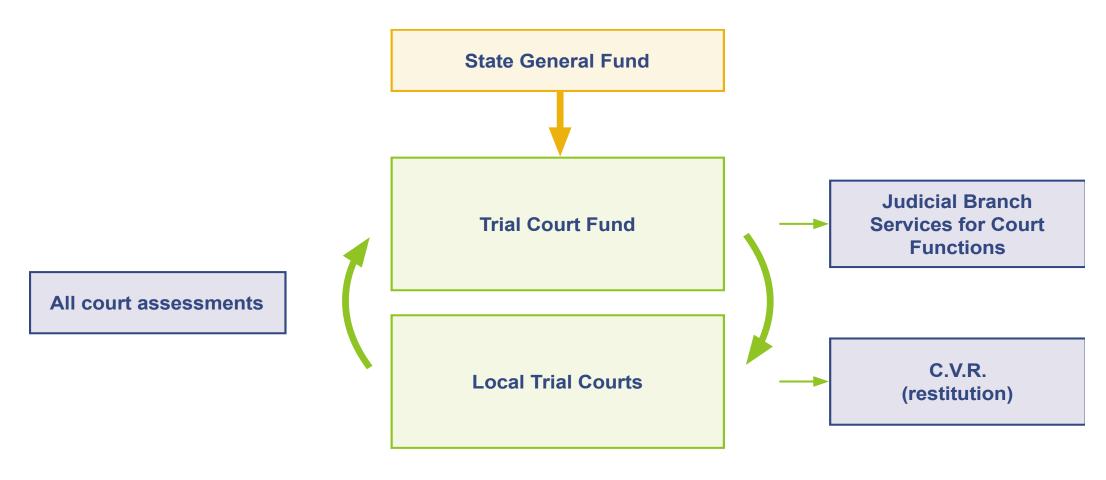

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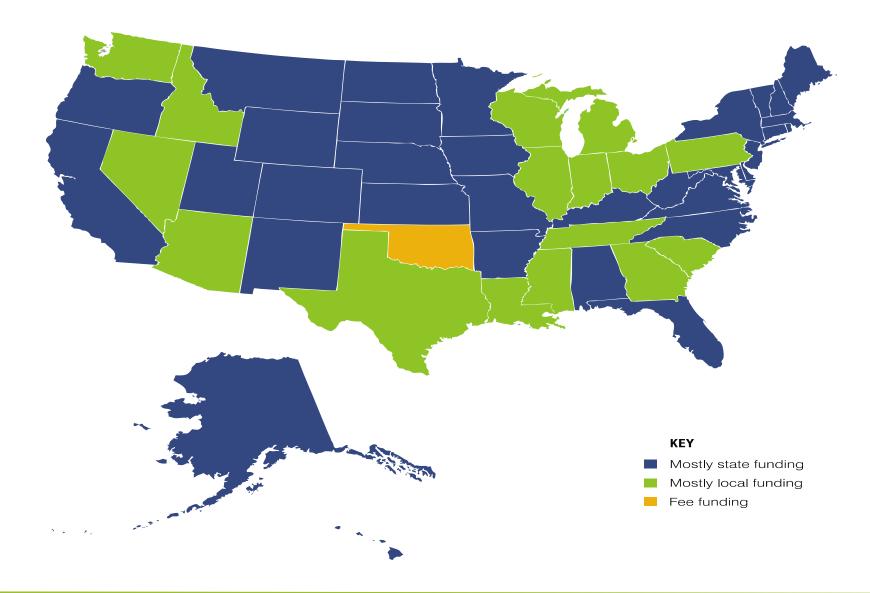
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A New Funding Model for Michigan Courts

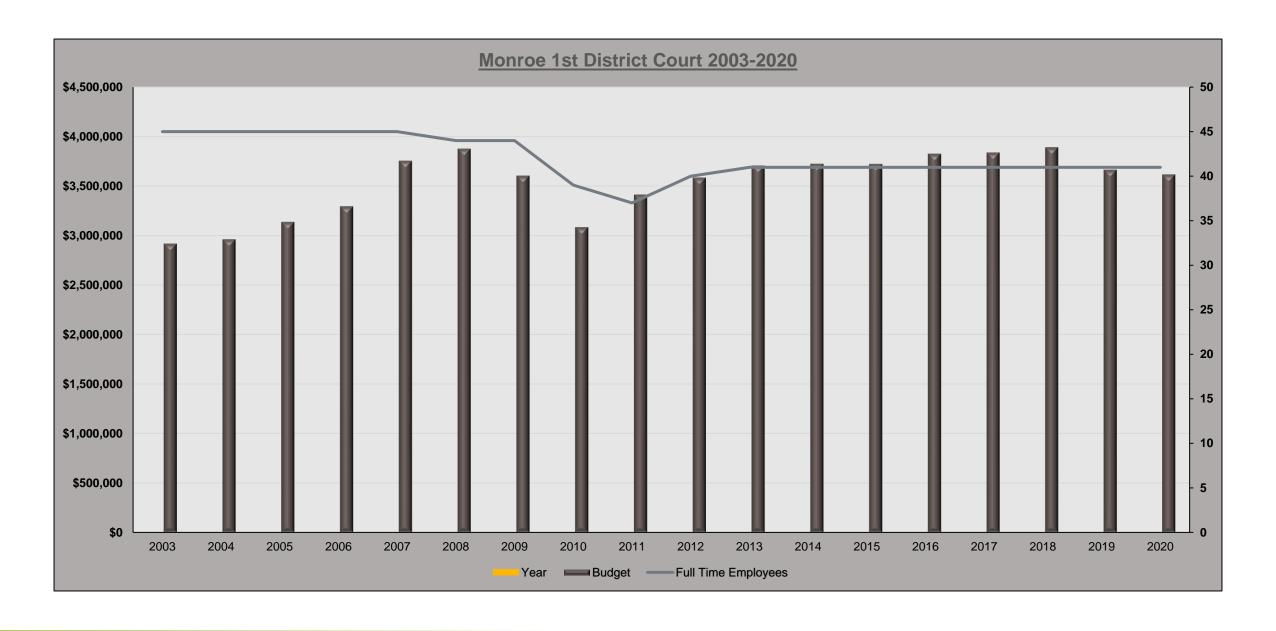

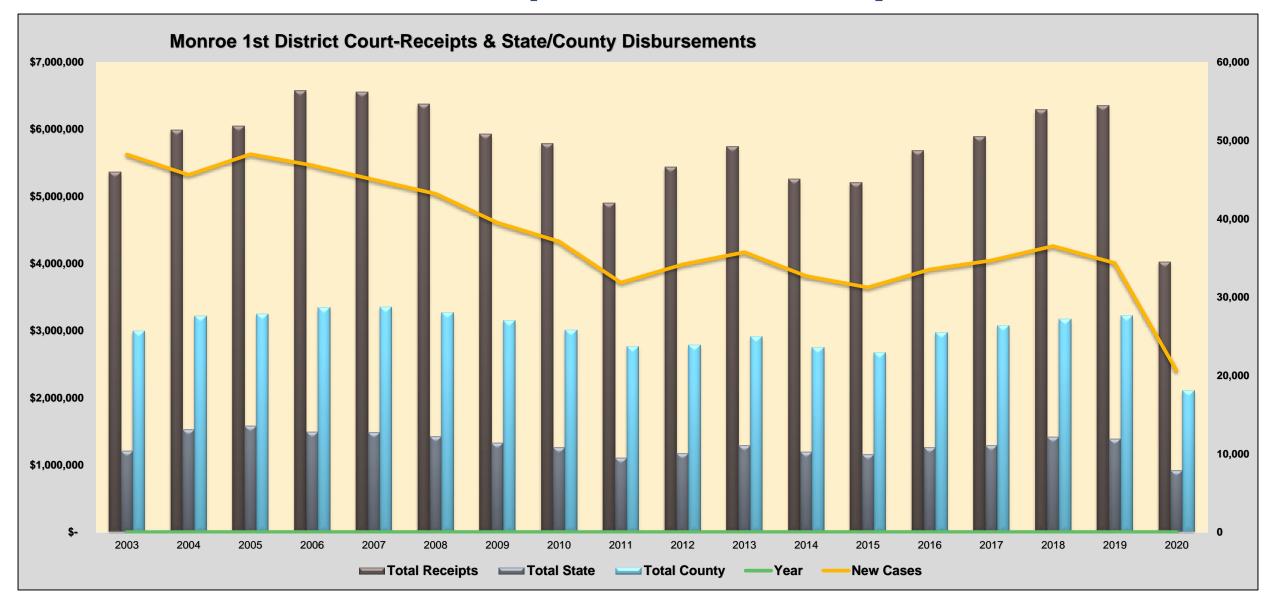

FORWARD LOOKING STEPS

- √ Have to begin somewhere-HB 4447 is a good place to begin
- ✓ Solutions should be scalable and phased-in
- √ Other state's transformation took 10 years
- ✓ Agency with authority & accountability can start to implement recommendations of the TCFC.
- √ Changes are going to impact courts and others:
 - -Should not be a deterrent to commence
 - -Each year numbers change: revenues, expenses, case counts (see following slides)
- ✓ All five (5) recommendations of TCFC focus on improving court system
