

Ukraine Invasion Impacts Agriculture

- Ukraine is the "breadbasket" of Europe and a major wheat/grains exporter
- Planting underway but heavily disrupted
- Meanwhile, Russia and Belarus are key suppliers of Potash and other fertilizers
- Fertilizer supply/demand imbalance sent prices soaring before Russian invasion






There are bright spots in the agricultural economy. Ag remains a pillar of Michigan's rural communities.



Sen. Victory introduces \$1.4B agriculture investment plan

LANSING, Mich. — <u>Sen. Roger Victory</u> on Wednesday sponsored an agriculture budget supplemental that would direct \$1.4 billion to improve Michigan's food security and invest in rural communities.

"The pandemic exposed serious flaws in our food supply chain. We must make targeted investments to reduce rising food costs and ensure Michigan families always have access to locally grown or produced food," said Victory, R-Hudsonville. "This


