

## FAQs from FEMA, March 27, 2020

Below are some responses we hope provide clarification. We look forward to continuing our work with you, informing Counties of this important information.

- 1. Why do Governors still need to request and receive a major disaster declaration for COVID-19 if the President's already declared a national emergency? Issuance of the national emergency declaration made available FEMA's emergency funding under Public Assistance Category B, without jurisdictions having to issue their own emergency declaration.
- Why is FEMA highlighting states with new major disaster declarations? Is this more for individual assistance and hazard mitigation programs? – FEMA declarations are public information, and available online at www.fema.gov/coronavirus, under "News Releases."
- Are all counties eligible now for reimbursement from Public Assistance for eligible activities and costs under Category B? Or just those counties in states with a major disaster declaration? –
  Expanding on #1, States/Tribes/Territories may request a Major Disaster Declaration to expand the categories of FEMA funding available (beyond PA Cat. B included in the national emergency declaration).
- 4. Can you help us clarify the different streams of money / pots of money *including eligibility process and criteria* under the Disaster Relief Fund for counties, including our sheriff departments, public health and overall public safety activities? The standard disaster programs and funding streams apply as approved/activated within each jurisdiction.
