How to Develop a Strategic Plan

- Define your process
- Possible elements of a plan
 - Mission/vision
 - Values
 - Goals

- Strategies/objectives
- Activities

Putting Your Plan to Use

- Action Planning
- Measuring and accountability
 - Specific, measurable, attainable, responsible person, time specific (SMART) goals
- Aligning with departmental plans
- Using the plan as a management tool
- Maintaining focus
- Reviewing the plan consistently

Words of Caution

- Implementation takes time
- Share the plan/integrate it into your work
- Don't manage daily tasks
- Keep it simple—don't overwhelm
- Make it meaningful

- Update it regularly—have a process
- Keep people accountable and empower them
- Don't plan a plan to plan
