Michigan Veterans - Demographics






Michigan's veteran population is older than that of the U.S. veteran population, with a significantly higher proportion of Vietnam veterans residing in the state.




Veteran Gender Demographics








Who is a Veteran?

Title 38 of the Code of Federal Regulations defines a veteran as "a person who served in the active military, naval, or air service and who was discharged or released under conditions other than dishonorable."









Vision: Veterans Choose Michigan

- Responsive to WWII, Korean War, Vietnam War and Cold War veterans
 - Health care, state veterans homes, quality of life
- Attractive to Gulf War and Post-9/11 veterans
 - Education, employment, quality of life







State Benefits: Employment

Veteran-Friendly Employer Program

- 400+ certified VFEs
 - MVAA offers employer trainings and webinars
 - More than 30,000 veterans hired

Transition Counselor Expos

- Partnership with MEDC
 - Reaches transitioning veterans nation-wide
 - Answers "Why Michigan?"





















State Benefits: Employment



Teaching Specific

- Troops to Teachers
- Reimbursement of military cert. fees
- Cert. extension for those called to AD

- Licensing and credentialing
 - Includes spouses
 - Examples of licensing resources and benefits:
 - Utilizing military experience toward licensing
 - Exempt from renewal fees and CE requirements while active duty
 - Temp. license for AD spouse
 - Waiver for initial application processing fee, initial license and/or initial registration fee for veterans
 - Reimbursement from USDVA for required and paid for exam fees




Veteran-Friendly School Program

- Postsecondary institutions approved to receive VA educational benefits eligible to apply
- Certified as Gold-, Silver-, or Bronze-level
- Certifications based on seven criteria
 - Established process for identification of current student veterans
 - Veteran-specific website
 - Active student veteran organization or club
 - Veteran-specific career services, resources, advising, and/or outcome monitoring
 - On-campus veterans coordinator and/or designated point of contact
 - System to evaluate and award academic credit based on prior military training and experience
 - Monitoring and evaluation of student veteran academic retention, progress, and graduation rates



State Benefits: Education



- Veteran-Friendly School Program
 - 61 Veteran-Friendly Schools for 2019-2020 academic year
 - Represent 11,143 service members and veterans
 - 53 evaluate military experience for academic credit
 - Interactive online Veteran-Friendly Schools Dashboard released 2019-2020








State Benefits: Emergency Assistance

- Michigan Veterans Trust Fund
 - \$50 million trust fund est. after WWII
 - For emergent needs
 - □ For war-time era veterans
- □ FY 2019
 - Served 1,679 veterans and their families
 - \$1,259,082 in grants awarded
 - Highest identified needs:
 - Shelter \$708,702
 - Utilities \$278,827
 - Transportation \$221,654





Federal (VA) Benefits




- Veterans Health Administration

 - 18 VA Community-Based Outpatient Clinics

 - 8 Vet Centers

 - Funds go directly to veterans
- Education and Employment
 - □ GI Bill®
 - Veteran Readiness and Employment Programs
- Medical Care
 - 39% of Michigan veterans are enrolled

 - 60 Accredited Veteran Service Officers












